News and Notes:

THIS WEEK

...and down the stretch they come! The Vancouver Warriors continue their March to May and a shot at the NLL playoffs with their biggest game of the season, a date with the San Diego Seals on Friday at Pechanga Arena in SoCal. The Warriors have won five straight (first time as a franchise since 2010) and six of seven to claw back into a playoff chase, and currently hold down the 8th and final playoff spot in the NLL standings.

Regardless of the outcome, the Warriors will have to wait until the completion of games on Saturday to learn their playoff fate, so the focus will be on what the team can control, and that is the game that they are playing in against the Seals.

LEADERSHIP GROUP

The Warriors announced their leadership group for this season, with Brett Mydske beginning his third year as Captain of the Black and Gold. Mydske is joined by Assistants Matt Beers, Ryan Dilks, Keegan Bal and Reid Bowering. Beers was the long time captain with Vancouver before returning to the Lower Mainland after a two year stretch in Saskatchewan. Dilks is also a former captain of Saskatchewan.

BALLER ON A HEATER

Warriors forward Keegan Bal continues to scorch the opposition while the team rides their hot streak. On the current 6-1 run the Warriors are on, Bal has scored 31 goals and added 25 assists for 56 points, scoring no fewer than three goals over that seven game span. Bal now leads the team with 45 goals, is second on the team with 59 assists and is first in overall points with 99. Bal has established a new career-high in goals and is even on his career-high number of points with 99, set in 21-22.

'BEEDS' BURNING BRIGHT

Warriors forward Adam Charalambides has also stepped up his game this season....and through this late season Warriors surge. Through 17 games, 'BEEDS' has potted 36 goals and has dished out a team leading 57 assists for 93 points (all three totals are new career highs), and an average points-per-game of 5.47, a 98-point pace. Over the past seven games, the Warriors lefty has scored 15 goals and handed out 32 assists for 47 points. Last season, Charalambides finished the season with 21 goals and 38 assists for 59 points, a 3.47 ppg clip. Charalambides leads the NLL with five short handed points this season.

WARRIORS D LEADING BY COMMITTEE

The Vancouver Warriors defense is dotted with leaders in various NLL categories. Owen Grant is among the defensive leaders in points and shorthanded goals (leads entire NLL with four), first among all d-men and second overall in short handed points with five, first in caused turnovers for rookies with 25, and is tied for second among rookies with 95 loose balls, along with his teammate Brayden Laity.

Reid Bowering is ranked in the top 10 amongst all defenders in scoring with 14 points and leads all Warriors with 106 loose balls. Ryan Dilks leads the NLL with 44 forced turnovers.

Every Warriors defender that has played in at least 15 games has at minimum 45 loose balls PER defender, with four (Laity, Grant, Dilks, and Bowering) all over 95 loosies each.

FIRST GOALS CLUB

This season, Jack Suboch, Owen Grant, Tyson Kirkness, Marcus Klarich and Brayden Laity have all hit the scoresheet with their first career NLL goals. Steph Charbonneau scored his first goal as a Warrior versus Halifax on April 5th.
